Privacy Incidents, News and News About Incidents

Jessica is an Associate Professor of Computer Science and Director of Privacy at NC State. Previously she was a research scientist and manager at Google, an area manager at Xerox PARC, and a research scientist at Bell Labs and RSA Labs. Jessica holds a PhD in Mathematics from U.C. Berkeley

Abstract: With the exception of data breaches, there are no publicly accessible databases of privacy incidents. This leaves many incidents of accidental data collection, cyberbullying, social media over-sharing, re-identification, etc., undocumented in any centralized way, making analysis of trends difficult. In this talk, I'll present a database of privacy incidents we're building at NCSU in collaboration with UNCC and Clemson. Currently the database is mostly fueled by privacy news and this talk will also include a descriptive, large-scale analysis of privacy news including sentiment, entities and keywords. This analysis both helps build the content of the database and informs the trends and attributes tracked.
